Creativity takes time, and we are constantly growing.


The only secret here is practice.



Print a reference photo. Ideally with drastic lighting. Trace the back with pencil.



Put the reference photo on canvas board. Trace the outside of the reference photo.

Make sure the pencil is transferring to the canvas board.

STEP 3

Use the color mixing wheel to mix colors.

Keep the palette simple. You need light tones, mid, dark, and shadows and highlights for each.




Start with the dark shadow colors and dark tones.

Then add mid tones, light tones, highlights, and the background.



Blend colors and fill in any missing spaces.

Outline the eyes and pupil. Add darks, then mid, then light, highlight, and glare to the eyes.



Blend colors and make sure there are no missing spots. Add whiskers and ear hair and sign!
